Each year thousands of native animals face death or injury from entanglement on barbed wire fences.



- Tens of millions of kilometres of fences subdivide the Australian landscape – 65% have barbed wire as the top strand
- More than 75 wildlife species in Australia are occasional or regular victims of barbed wire
- Nocturnal animals such as owls and gliders are particularly vulnerable

Barb Busters working bees bring people together to remove barbed wire from internal fences on working properties to create safer habitat for our native animals.
